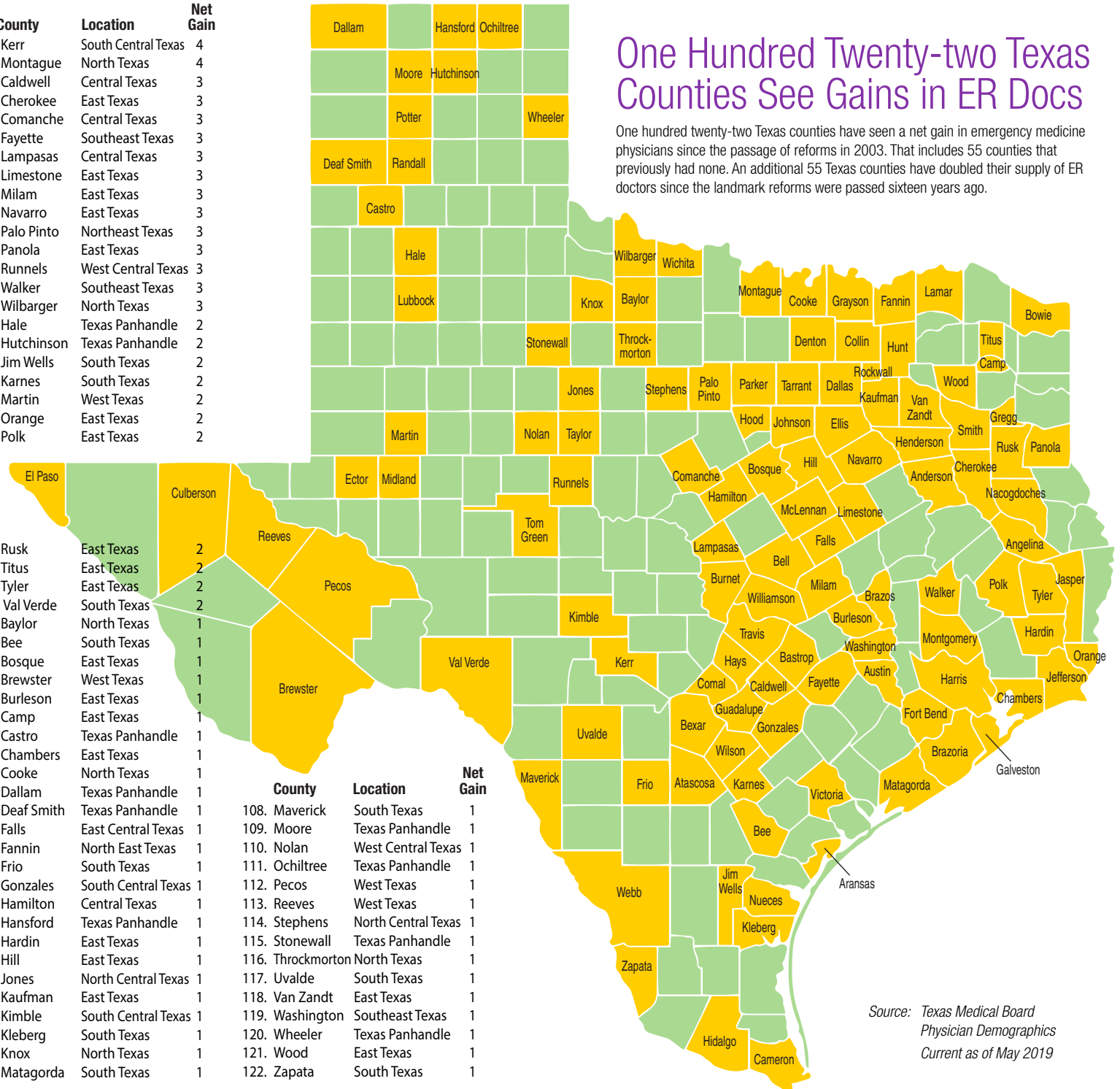

One Hundred Twenty-two Texas Counties See Gains in ER Docs

One hundred twenty-two Texas counties have seen a net gain in emergency medicine physicians since the passage of reforms in 2003. That includes 55 counties that previously had none. An additional 55 Texas counties have doubled their supply of ER doctors since the landmark reforms were passed sixteen years ago.
